ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- be between **15 and 30 years** of age at the start of the employment period;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*; and,
- be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

Clayworx is seeking a Workshops Assistant to help with behind-the-scenes preparation and finishing of workshop pieces. The successful applicant will work closely alongside the Studio Technician, the Program Manager, and ceramics instructors to be mentored and assigned daily studio tasks and responsibilities related to workshops.

Apart from the professional working experience, the youth employee will gain exposure to technical, operating skills, and material knowledge in the field of ceramic arts. The Studio Technician will provide supervision and mentorship relating to the technical/theoretical processes that involve glaze chemistry, kiln firing techniques, programming kiln firing schedules, and will be covered throughout the youth's employment. Our experienced instructors and Program Manager will provide the youth with mentorship and opportunities to expand their knowledge base and creativity in maintaining and operating a working clay studio.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Assist with classroom and studio responsibilities:
 - Maintain clean and safe classrooms and studio following a high standard of health and safety guidelines.
 - Prepare tools and clay for onsite and offsite workshops (the youth will not travel offsite).
 - Track and finish workshop pieces to ensure all pieces are fired and returned in a timely manner.
 - Pack up finished work and communicate with the Program Manager when work is ready for pick up.
 - Monitor workshop glazes, slips and other materials and supplies and well as potentially reclaiming excess workshop clay.
 - Understand and reinforce general rules and policies of Clayworx to maintain a positive atmosphere.

- Maintain a supportive and positive environment for program participants.
2. Assist Clayworx staff with daily studio operations and special events during the summer as needed.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- At least 2 years of previous professional experience working in an art-making environment.
- Excellent customer service skills and enjoy working with children.
- Must understand the basics of the daily studio operation as well as health and safety guidelines.
- Be able to communicate both verbally and through written work in a thorough, clear and timely manner.
- Ability to effectively work with others to achieve optimal collective results.
- Ability to lift and carry heavy materials, such as 30-50 lbs boxes of clay, occasionally.
- Strong attention to detail.
- Ability to keep track of multiple small projects simultaneously
- Proficiency at trimming work on a potters wheel and glazing and quality control of pieces to be fired.
- Have or be willing to obtain a current Vulnerable Sector Check.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Previous professional experience in ceramics studio.
- Previous teaching experience in working with children.
- Current First Aid, CPR, WHIMIS Certification.
