PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Seventeen dedicated members of the London Potters Guild came together for a day on Sunday, February 22 to discuss how to continue to strengthen the operational foundation at London Clay Art Centre.

The group decided that there are 3 key areas of focus for the next 18 months:

- Strategic Planning define our strategy, or direction, and make decisions about the allocation of resources to pursue the strategy. This involves setting goals and determining specific actions and timelines in which to achieve the goals.
- Organizational analysis examine all programs at London Clay Art Centre to determine areas of improvement and greater efficiency in terms of cost recovery and increased revenue to support the organization's sustainability.
- 3. Management explore grant programs that can provide seed funding to support the salary of a Manager/Executive Director at LCAC for up to 3 years. This would give us time to develop a plan for sustaining the position.

In addition, the board, in conjunction with Sandy, Kaitlyn and Cheryl, will be tackling some remaining capital projects to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of the studios, such as putting industrial laminate flooring under the south sink in the members' studio, devising a system to properly dispose of the clay sludge mopped off floors and extracted from the sinks, and building a storage shed to house the raku kilns and winter equipment, etc. As plans develop, you will re-

ceive periodic updates on progress.

On March 6, the marvelous Empty Bowls committee and many volunteers mounted the most successful event to date, exceeding its fundraising goal in sup-



port of the El Sistema Aeolian program. There can be no doubt of the importance of the London Potters Guild and London Clay Art Centre to the community.

I would like to welcome some new faces to key volunteer leadership roles. Margaret Nickle has taken over as LCAC Store coordinator from Genet Hodder and Sandra Paterson. She will use her experience in retail to build on the success of the store. Judy Riseling is taking over from Patti Wilk to coordinate internal workshops to keep our members engaged and on a path of continuous learning. And, Cassandra Prokop is taking over membership coordination from Teresa Ainsworth as she heads off to tour the world for a year.

Many, many thanks to Genet, Sandra, Patti and Teresa for their long-standing and significant contributions to the LPG and LCAC. We have all benefitted from your tremendous talents and dedication.

Spring is upon us and so is the next LPG sale. Summer clay camps for kids are on the horizon as is the Old East Village Block Party and the Home County Folk Festival. Be sure to get involved over the next few

months. It's a great opportunity to meet enthusiastic, talented potters and to learn more about your community.

EMPTY BOWLS

The 2015 edition of the Empty Bowls Event was the most successful yet. Ticket sales exceeded our most optimistic estimate - 403 were sold! Although the final tally of funds raised isn't finished yet, the recipient group (El Sistema) will be getting around \$10,000. The soups were as usual amazing - my favourites were the creamy potato with rosemary and the curried lentil dahl.

The amazing LPG members threw, trimmed, decorated, glazed and fired over 500 bowls. This year we started earlier with a Superbowl Saturday in December (2014) in which about 16 members threw over 200 bowls. Another Superbowl in January added another 200 or so and our wonderful members added another 100 on their own. This year, we received many compliments on the decorated bowls - some saying we are getting better and more creative each year, even though they thought we couldn't possibly top the year before. Thank you to each and every one of you. We couldn't put this on without you.

As most of you know, the funds raised this year will go towards the food portion of the El Sistema program run by the Aeolian Hall (our neighbour to the east). El Sistema is a music program based on the one which was started in Venezuela in 1975. It offers musical learning opportunities to children, regardless of their background, ability, gender or financial need.

The program offers 6 hours of instruction a week (4 days a week right after school). The children get a snack when they arrive, practice for an hour and a half and then get a full hot meal after the practice is over. The instruction includes orchestras, choir, string instruments, piano and gamelan. The program includes having the children perform publically every 6-8 weeks at the Aeolian Hall. Performances are admis-





sion by donation and are well worth attending. The evening dinner sitting had the opportunity to listen to some 30 members of El Sistema as they sang and performed to great applause.

The children got to chose a bowl of their own and went home proudly clutching their bowls. Really cute - especially the little ones with their Aeolian Hall t-shirts that went down to their knees.



We would like to thank publicly the donors of Silent Auction items - your generosity allowed us to raise another thousand dollars - Pauline Durham, Melody Green, Lynn Haslam, Jenn Jack, David Moynihan, Jordan Scott, Chris Snedden, Christine Tischler and Fran Whitney.
